SUBJECT: Information Paper, National Defense Cadet Corps (NDCC)

1. Purpose. To provide information of the National Defense Cadet Corps (NDCC)
2. Facts.

a. The JROTC program originated as part of the National Defense Act of 1916. Title 10 United States Code, Section 2031, and Section 4651 are the implementing authority for the JROTC and NDCC programs. NDCC programs and the host institutions operate in accordance with statutory requirements, Army Regulation 145-2, and Cadet Command Regulation 145-2.

b. A NDCC program is virtually identical to JROTC except it is fully funded by schools that choose to pursue a JROTC unit without financial assistance from the Army. The school incurs all costs to include instructor salaries, uniforms, and daily operational expenses. Currently, there are 3 NDCC units across the United States. The following is an estimate of the expenses which will be incurred (an average of 150 cadets):

(1) Start-up Costs:

c. The Army will supply curriculum material for the instructors and the students. The Army will also supply forms and regulations that are required to successfully conduct the program.

d. Schools hosting an NDCC unit must comply with statutory and regulatory guidance as regular JROTC units; specifically, units must employ a minimum of two instructors certified by HQ USACC.
